Mrs. Anna Sue Armstrong, 87, of Bartlesville, passed away at home on Friday, December 15, 2017.

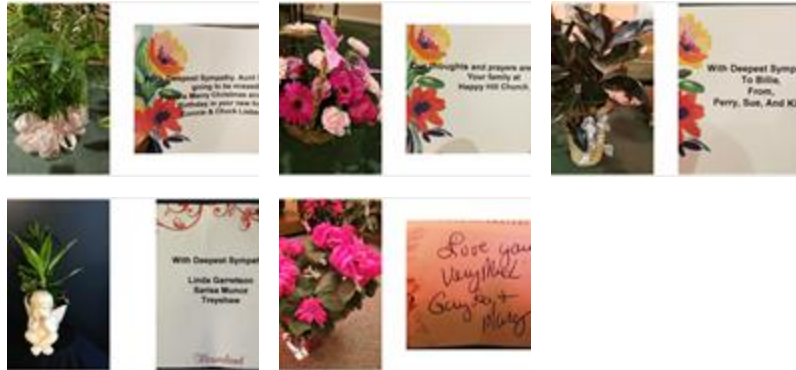

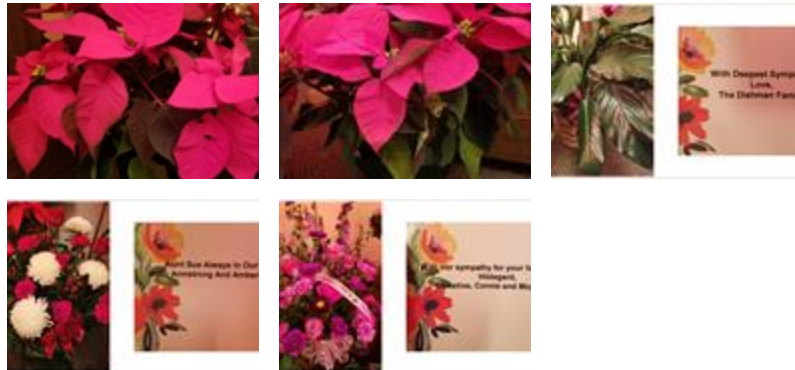

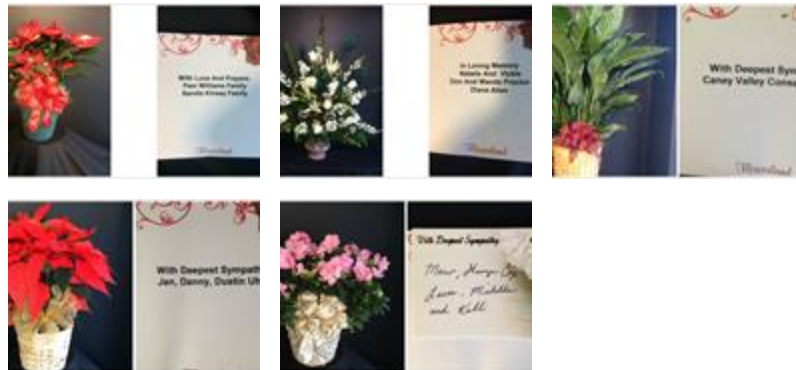
