Mr. Billy Joe Barker, 92, of Ramona, died at 8:49 A.M. on Monday, May 5, 2014 at the Bartlesville Health & Rehab facility.

Funeral services for Mr. Barker will be held at 2 P.M. on Wednesday, May 7, 2014 at the Friends Church in Ramona with Pastor Jess Madaffari of Skiatook, Okla. and Mr. Joe Rozell officiating. Interment will be in the Ramona Cemetery where full military rites will be accorded by the Ceremonial Detail of the James H. Teel American Legion Post # 105 of Bartlesville. Funeral services and interment will be directed by the Stumpff Funeral Home & Crematory.

Mr. Barker was born on March 1, 1922 at Ramona, Oklahoma to Mamie T. (Gott) and Roy Thomas Barker. He grew up and received his education in the Ramona area and graduated from Ramona High School in 1940. He entered the U.S. Army on October 6, 1942 and served during World War II in the Pacific Theatre. Following his Honorable Discharge on December 1, 1945 he returned to Ramona area. He was married to Mary Ann Fugate and they have made their home in the Ramona area all of their married life. Mr. Barker has been active his entire life as a cattle rancher in the Ramona area until ill health several years ago limited his activities.

Mr. Barker is survived by his wife, Mary Ann Barker, one son, Tom Barker of Ramona, and two grandchildren, Beth Barker and Roy Barker and his wife Taylor, two nieces and three nephews. He was preceded in death by his

parents, Roy T. Barker and Mamie T. Barker, a son, Benny Joe Barker in 1994, one sister, Eva Lee Woodworth and one brother, Roy C. Barker.
