



Bobby Lee Widowski

May 22, 1929 - August 1, 2011

Bobby Lee Widowski, 82 resident of Wann died Monday at his residence. Memorial services will be held at 10:00 A.M., Saturday in the Kingdom Life Church with Pastor Jason Wilson officiating. Cremation arrangements were under the direction of the Stumpff Funeral Home & Crematory.

Mr. Widowski was born to William L. and Edna (Greenway) Widowski on May 22, 1929 at Bartlesville, OK. He was raised and received his education in the Bartlesville and Dewey School system. Bobby joined the U.S. Army in 1948 serving his country during the Korean Conflict until his honorable discharge in 1952. He met Ethel May Peterson in Bartlesville and married her August 3, 1952 celebrating 59 years of marriage and from this union came 3 girls and 1 son.

Bobby began his career working at Portland Cement while maintaining his farm in Wann. He also worked for the City of Bartlesville when he and Ethel decided to open a dairy while still farming and custom hay bailing for area ranchers. He had lived on his farm for over 51 years working the land. Mr. Widowski was a member of the American Legion post 105, Veteran of Foreign Wars of Dewey, The American Legion Baseball team and the Farmers Union. He loved supporting kids working as a team and always attended his grand children's baseball games. Bobby also enjoyed auctions, farm sales, attending stockyard sales around the area, fishing and hunting birds.

Survivors include his wife Ethel May Widowski, 3 daughters: Bonnie M. Kraft and husband Larry of Sperry, Tena L. Moody of Cleveland, and Dana K. Langbein and husband Scott of Dewey; 1 son William L. (Willie) Widowski and wife Judy of Sperry, 2 brothers: Clyde Widowski and wife Francis and Clifford Widowski and wife Judy both of Amarillo, TX; 16 grandchildren, 23 great-grandchildren, several cousins, nieces and nephews. Bobby was predeceased by his parents and 7 siblings: Paul, James, Claude, Lucille, Katheryn, Leroy and Clarence.
