



Carol Sue Smith

September 14, 1940 - August 22, 2022

Carol Sue Smith, devoted mother, sister and teacher, passed away August 22, 2022, at the age of 81. She was born September 14, 1940, in Sallisaw, Oklahoma, to Dr. Willie G. Smith and Helen Hamilton Smith. Her family moved to Shidler, and later to Billings, before settling in Nowata. She graduated from Nowata High School in 1958.

Carol attended University of Central Oklahoma, where she earned a bachelor's degree in Education, as well as a master's degree in Education with an emphasis in Business Education & Journalism. She began her career as a secretary at the State Department of Education in Oklahoma City. From 1963 to 1991, she taught business, journalism and technology, as well as serving in school administration in schools in Oklahoma and Kansas. Most significantly, Carol's career included 17 years at Catoosa High School, where she was a beloved teacher. After retiring in 1991, she continued to teach business, computing, and accounting at Tulsa Job Corps Center and Rogers State University. She also worked in her own business until 2007, providing bookkeeping and tax preparation services.

Throughout her life and career, Carol extended herself to students and others who needed extra support and encouragement, and she routinely took them into her life and home. Many of her students were impacted by her generosity and became lifelong friends. Despite receiving honors such as Apple Computer Teacher of the Year, Carol was more rewarded by her students and their success than by any accolades for her efforts.

She is preceded in death by her father, Dr. Willie G. Smith, and mother, Helen (Hamilton) Smith and beloved nephew Michael Smith. She is survived by her son Jeff Smith, of Dewey, sister Dr. Nancy Smith of Tulsa and brother Dr. Bill Smith of Bartlesville, nephew Doug Smith of Tulsa and nieces Ree Drummond of Pawhuska and Betsy Smith of Seattle, as well as numerous dear friends. A memorial service will be held at 10:00am on August 26, 2022, at Stumpff Funeral Home Chapel in Bartlesville.
