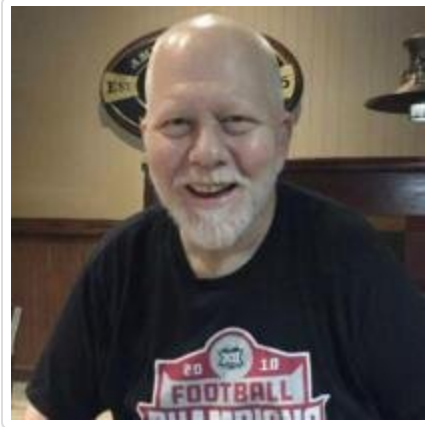




Donald Dwain Dearman
