Ethel F. Bowdre, 94 died at 7:08 P.M. on Sunday February 8, 2015 at the Forrest Manor Nursing Center in Dewey.

Mrs. Bowdre was born February 25, 1920 at Cleveland, Oklahoma to John Henry and Ruth Marjorie (McCorkle) Stearman. She was raised and received her education there graduating from Cleveland High School. She was united in marriage to Louis Allen Bowdre on July 2, 1941 at the Cleveland Christian Church, at Cleveland, Oklahoma. There made their home in several towns during Louis Military service in the Army, until moving to Dewey in 1954, and made their home there and then in Bartlesville as Mr. Bowdre was employed by the U.S. Postal Service in Bartlesville. Mrs. Bowdre had worked for several years at the Washington County Memorial Hospital as a Nurse's Aide, but her primary occupation was that of a wife and homemaker. She was dedicated to her husband, children and grandchildren. If only there was space to tell all of the hilarious stories about her and her life experiences "The Little Lady was a Hoot" and all that had the privilege of knowing her, knew that.
