Mr. George "Howard" Ruddick, 82, of Bartlesville, died at 6:43 P.M. on Monday, June 6, 2011..

Mr. Ruddick was born at Goodman, Missouri on March 22, 1929 the son of George Hugh and Dollie (Vice) Ruddick. He grew up in the Tiff City, Missouri area and entered the U.S. Army on February 14, 1950. He served in Germany during the Korean Conflict and received his Honorable Discharge on January 21, 1953. He was married to June Mary Johnson at Ponca City, Oklahoma on May 29, 1954. They have made their home in Bartlesville since that time. Mr. Ruddick was employed with the City of Bartlesville in February of 1954 and remained with them until his retirement in 1995 as the Chief City Inspector. He loved to hunt and fish and was a member of the Trinity Baptist Church.

Mr. Ruddick is survived by his wife, June Mary Ruddick of the home in Bartlesville, three sons, John Ruddick and wife Robbin of Cheney, Kansas, Jerry Ruddick and wife Sandy of Bartlesville and David Ruddick of Broken Arrow. Also surviving is Mary June Bates of Newnan, Georgia, a niece who was raised as a daughter, fifteen grandchildren, and ten great grandchildren.
