James Matthew Stayton, 35, formerly of Bartlesville, died on Saturday, March 21, 2020 at his home in Kent, Washington.

James Matthew Stayton was born in Bartlesville, Oklahoma on January 24, 1985 the son of Randolph James Stayton and Sara Beth (Wheat) Stayton. He grew up and received his early education in various locations and then graduated from Desert Mountain High School in Scottsdale, Arizona in 2003.
