Mr. John Robert Blankenship, 64, resident of Dewey, died Wednesday in Bartlesville.

“ *I was sorry to hear about John. At one time he was a very good friend. We served in the 390th MIMS in Tucson Arizona together, both of us BMATs, both out of place in a maintenance squadron. I remember a trip we took to Vandenberg Air Force Base in his mini Cooper. We stopped in Riverside, visited the biggest pinball arcade I'd ever seen and everyone knew John.
