Kendal Lee (Clark) Hudson, 46, of Bixby and formerly of Bartlesville, died early Tuesday morning, July 5, 2011 at her home in Bixby.

She graduated from Bartlesville High School in 1983 and then attended the University of Oklahoma at Norman where she was a

member of the Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority. She graduated with a degree in Pharmacy from the University of Oklahoma in 1988. She was named as and featured in the 1988 edition of "Outstanding Young Women of America" in 1988. Following her graduation she worked as a pharmacist in Chattanooga, Tennessee and later at various pharmacy locations in Tulsa. She loved the outdoors and animals and regularly took in strays and was very involved in her children's activities.

Kendal is survived by one son, Kameron Kent Hudson and one daughter, Kandace Lee Hudson both of Tulsa, her parents, Jim and Peggy Clark of Bartlesville, one sister, Dayna Lynn Hayes of Bartlesville and her friend, Brad Wagoner of Tulsa.. She was preceded in death by her paternal grandparents, Russell and Evelyn Clark and by her maternal grandparents, Jay and Velma Potter.
