Mr. Marvin Dale Geeding, 75, a longtime Bartlesville area resident, died at 11:30 A.M. on Monday, April 20, 2015 at his ranch home in Nowata County. Funeral services for Mr. Geeding will be held at 10 A.M. on Saturday at the First United Methodist Church in Nowata, Oklahoma with Rev. Cheryl Newton officiating and Rev. Bill Dudley to assist. Interment will be in the Memorial Park Cemetery in Bartlesville directed by the Stumpff Funeral Home & Crematory. Mr. Geeding was born in Buffalo Township, Missouri on October 29, 1939 to Merle and Dora May (Cook) Geeding. He grew up and received his education in McDonald County, Missouri and came to Bartlesville to make his home in 1957. He was married to Doris Jean Gardner on August 7, 1957 at Anderson, Missouri and they have made their home in the Bartlesville area since that time. Mr. Geeding was active in the services station business all of his adult life. He owned and operated Marvin's 66 at Frank Phillips Blvd & Wyandotte until 1975. He then became owner operator of Marvin's Limestone Texaco on Nowata Road from 1975 until 1980 and then Marvin's Texaco in Dewey from 1990 until 1995. Since 1995 he has been active as a cattle rancher at his ranch in Nowata County east of Bartlesville. He loved to be on his ranch with his cattle and horses. He was a past member of the Loyal Order of the Moose.

Mr. Geeding is survived by his wife Doris of the home, three children, Kathy "Kate" Cramer and husband, Danny of Bartlesville, Mike Geeding and wife Janet of Nowata and Debbie Moody and husband Jimmy of Bartlesville, one brother, Sid Geeding and wife Vickie of Blue Grass, Iowa, one sister, Georgia Beshears and husband Jack of Bartlesville, six grandchildren, six great grandchildren, a lifetime friend, Richard King of Bartlesville, and a numerous nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers, Frank Geeding in infancy and Douglas Geeding and a sister-in-law, Jackie Geeding.
