Mr. Stephen Orland "Steve" Blass, 68, died at 11:45 P.M. on Saturday, July 26, 2014 at his home in Bartlesville.

Funeral services for Mr. Blass will be held at 10 A.M. Tuesday, July 29, 2014 at the Spirit Church in Bartlesville with Pastor Darryl Wootton officiating.

Interment will be in the Oglesby Cemetery directed by the Stumpff Funeral Home & Crematory.
