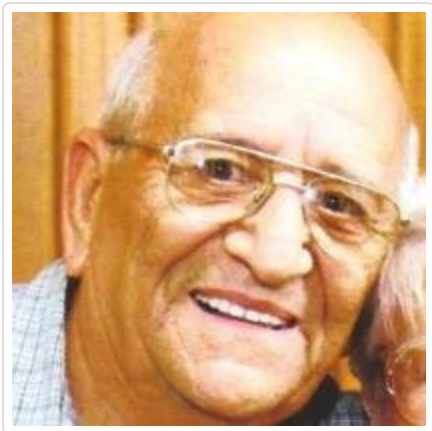




Virgil A. Franco

Virgil A. Franco, 83, of Bartlesville, Oklahoma, passed away Monday, December 31, 2018.

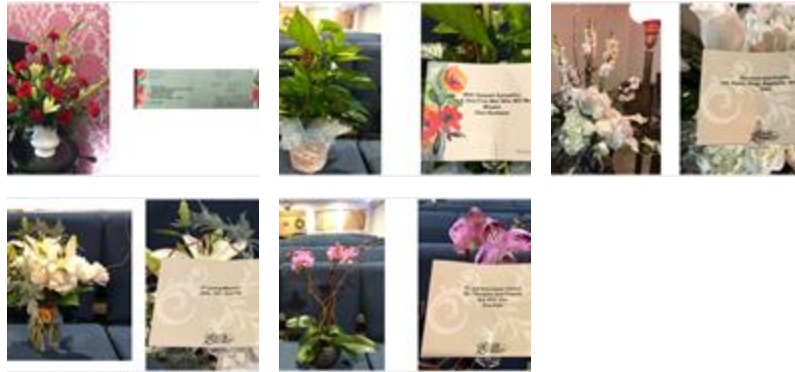

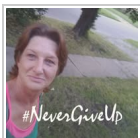
